In Pennsylvania, there are thousands of occupations available for young adults to pursue. To simplify the career exploration process, we introduce students to five broad "pathways." Within these five over-arching career pathways are additional, more specific careers and occupations.

Arts & Communication

Careers that involve designing, producing, exhibiting, performing, writing and publishing multimedia content including visual and performing arts and design, journalism and entertainment services.

Business, Finance & Information Technology

Careers that encompass planning, organization, directing and evaluating business functions essential to efficient and productive business operations. Business Management and Administration career opportunities are available in every sector of the economy.

Engineering & Industrial Technology

Careers in designing, planning, managing, building and maintaining the built environment; designing and processing materials into intermediate or final products; and maintaining machinery and transportation technology.

Human Services

Careers relating education and training services, governance; national security; foreign service; revenue and taxation, and hospitality & tourism.

Science & Health

Careers in the life, physical and behavioral science, as well as planning, managing and providing of therapeutic services, diagnostic services, health information and biochemistry research development. This pathway also includes careers in the agriculture sciences, engineering and math.
